


## ART EXHIBIT PROGRAM

Established 1975, the City of Edmonds Arts Commission (EAC), as part of the City of Edmonds Parks, Recreation & Cultural Services Department, exists to ensure the arts are an integral part of our community's quality of life, economic vitality, and central identity.

The goal of the EAC art exhibit program is to provide a forum where the public can develop an awareness, appreciation, and understanding of the visual arts through the exhibition of quality art works. The objectives to meet this goal are:

- To provide space to display artwork, and present an annual program of rotating exhibits featuring artwork by local and regionally-based emerging and professional artists.
- To exhibit select pieces from the City of Edmonds Portable Collection, the Sister City Hekinan Japan Collection, and other special juried shows.

## **EDMONDS LIBRARY ART EXHIBIT WALL 650 MAIN ST**

The Library Art Wall space features rotating six-week exhibits throughout the year of solo and group shows. Located in the southeast corner of the library, this public space features two slatted hanging walls with fixed lighting for up to approximately twenty two-dimensional framed artworks (see picture on the front of this brochure). The primary display area measures 32' by 6'. The secondary display area measures 7' from the east wall corner. A third display area offers an additional 14' of display area. Low study desks allow for good visibility of artwork from the entrance of the library.

## **FRANCES ANDERSON CENTER DISPLAY CASES 700 MAIN ST**

### **EDMONDS ARTS COMMISSION ART DISPLAY CASE**

Located in the lobby around the corner from the front desk, this built-in case with lockable glass sliding doors provides a secured space for two and three-dimensional work. Rotating six-week to two-month exhibits throughout the year of solo and group shows. The case is 8'9" W x 5'3" H x 23" D, and is equipped with fixed lighting and ventilation. Pedestals are available.

### **McDEVITT YOUTH ART DISPLAY CASE**

Artwork created by youth, ages 14-20, who live in the Edmonds area. Two and three-dimensional work. Monitor and computer drive available for digital display. Solo or group shows, six-weeks to three-months. The case is 70" wide, 60" high and 12" deep.

## **"ON THE FENCE" TEMPORARY PUBLIC ART THREE DOWNTOWN LOCATIONS**

On the Fence program provides three downtown fence sites for temporary art installations: Frances Anderson Center play field along Main Street (pictured); 6th Ave N along Civic Park; Dayton St & 2nd Ave S next to the ArtWorks parking lot. Artists may indicate a preferred site, but the EAC has final approval. Artists are responsible for attaching artwork by approved methods to a fence for a minimum of two months, and up to four months. Materials must be appropriate for the weather conditions and must not degrade or pollute. The usable portion of the fence measures approximately 5' x 20 - 80', depending on the site.

## **APPLICATION and EXHIBIT INFORMATION**

Artists may apply to have their work exhibited at any time during the year. The EAC has final approval. Artists must deliver and pick up their work at a mutually agreed upon time. The arts staff or EAC committee member sets the exhibit. Sales are handled directly by the artist and no commission will be charged on sale of artwork. A list of prices and contact information must be posted with the exhibit. Artworks are exhibited at the risk of the artist.

**LIBRARY and EAC DISPLAY CASE:** Interested artists are asked to send a resume, letter of interest, and up to 10 digital images for consideration. All two-dimensional work must be framed or mounted, and wired for a wall hook. An artist statement is preferred to display along with all exhibits, but is not required. Interpretive information is provided by the artist when appropriate. The EAC promotes indoor exhibits through Art Walk Edmonds, press releases to local press, and on its website.

**YOUTH ART DISPLAY CASE:** Student artists may apply to exhibit artwork independently or through art programs in the Edmonds area schools and Edmonds Community College. An exhibit can be representative of a class, or can be a body of work by one or more talented students. Students are encouraged to discuss the opportunity with their school's art teacher before contacting the EAC. Interested students can send a letter of interest with their full name, address, name of the school they are attending and up to 5 digital images of their work.

**ON THE FENCE:** Applications must include an installation proposal, resume, letter of interest and digital images of representative work. A stipend of \$500 is available for approved installations.
