ORDINANCE NO. 3362

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF EDMONDS, WASHINGTON, REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 3355 AND THE MORATORIUM IMPOSED THEREIN, AND FIXING A TIME WHEN THE SAME SHALL BECOME EFFECTIVE.

WHEREAS, the City adopted a zoning moratorium on the acceptance of building permit applications for the construction or expansion of community churches, served only by collector streets; and

WHEREAS, in accordance with the requirements of RCW 35A.63.220, the City Council held a public hearing on May 14, 2001. Based upon the evidence and testimony presented at such hearing, the City Council finds it to be in the public interest to lift the zoning moratorium; and

WHEREAS, the City Council has received the recommendation of its Planning Board that such moratorium be lifted, NOW, THEREFORE,

THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF EDMONDS, WASHINGTON, DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. Ordinance No. 3355 is hereby repealed.

Section 2. Effective Date. This ordinance, being an exercise of a power specifically delegated to the City legislative body, is not subject to referendum, and shall take effect five (5) days after passage and publication of an approved summary thereof consisting of the title.
