(Edmonds – WA) The much-awaited Edmonds Historic Calendar goes on sale this week.

You can download your order form at the City of Edmonds Historic Preservation Commission web page, http://www.edmondswa.gov/government/boards-and-commissions/historic-preservation-commission.html. Submission instructions are on the form.

If you'd rather order in person, stop by the table in front of the Edmonds Chamber office, just across from the Log Cabin on Fifth Avenue, during this week's Third Thursday Art Walk.

"Lots of people have been asking about the calendar, and we anticipate they'll go quickly," said Larry Vogel, chair of the Edmonds Historic Preservation Commission. "To help make sure everyone who wants a calendar can get one, we've added a downloadable order form and email address."

Calendars cost \$5 each. If you order before December 6 you'll receive a \$0.50 discount, lowering your cost to \$4.50.
