
These values were clearly apparent during the recent Creative District retreat, where members from Edmonds arts organizations, including the EAC, met to discuss a work plan for the next five years. This plan--required as part of recertification as a Creative District every five years--is an important tool to help

keep the district's collective efforts aligned and of the highest impact. The group focused on several of the goals of the last five years, and reaffirmed their importance for the next five years. They are:

- Strengthening and expanding creative identity
- Leveraging and connecting creative experiences
- Retaining and attracting creative businesses and nonprofits

The past five years have been beset by several challenges. The district coped by banding together over a shared purpose and the impact that the arts community makes in people's lives. The district advisory committee is excited about its next half-decade and what its members can accomplish together.

Longtime Edmonds Resident d'Elaine Johnson's World Waters Exhibit

Johnson, titled "World Waters", at the Edmonds Art Festival Gallery in the Frances Anderson Center, 700 Main St., April 3rd through May 22nd.

The exhibit features Johnson's celebration of the cultural and mystical that make up the history of north America through her signature interest in water, the sea and ocean. "Silent Sea", a recent donation to the City of Edmonds Public Art Collection, is a focal point of the show.

A resident of Edmonds since 1956, Johnson, who recently celebrated her 91st birthday, is a prolific painter with nearly two thousand paintings to her credit. Her work has been featured in hundreds of exhibits, and is featured in many public, corporate, and private collections. She cites her inspiration as her former teaching career and her experiences as a scuba diver. Johnson has two other paintings in the Edmonds Public Art collection: "Raven," which hangs in City Council Chambers, and an early work titled "Haines Wharf", located in the lobby of City Hall

d'Elaine will be available during the April and May Art Walk Edmonds events (third Thursday evenings) in the gallery, 5:00 - 8:00pm.

Apply for 2024 Lodging Tax Promotion Awards by May 25

Edmonds Lodging Tax is revenue from a special excise tax of 2% on the sale of, or charge made for, the furnishing of lodging by a hotel, rooming house, tourist court, motel, trailer camp, etc., and the granting of any similar license to use real property. State Law restricts the use of the tax to fund facilities or promote programs, activities and/or events that will serve to attract visitors to Edmonds. To that end, each year two community grants are offered for services to produce and market events/programs that contribute to economic vitality through attracting attendees or participants from outside of Edmonds. One award is offered to general non-profit organizations, and the other is specifically for arts-related non-profit programs.


